



Fall 2017 Conditions of Admission Transfer Students

Congratulations! Your academic achievements have earned you admission to the University of California, Merced. You must submit a Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) by June 1, 2017, in order to secure your admission to UC Merced. Failure to submit your SIR may result in your admission being withdrawn.

Before submitting your SIR, please read and make sure you understand the Conditions of Admission listed below. Submitting your SIR and accepting this offer of admission signifies your acknowledgment that failure to satisfy any of the conditions listed below will result in UC Merced withdrawing the offer of admission. Please note that the \$250 SIR fee is nonrefundable, even if your offer of admission is withdrawn.

Applicants are solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of all academic information they report to UC Merced. If your self-reported information is inconsistent with your actual grades and courses, it will result in cancellation of admission and may jeopardize future admission to any campus of the University of California.

Our admission decision was based on the information you reported in your application. Accuracy is essential to the admissions process, and you must report any changes in your information immediately, regardless of whether you believe that your admission will be affected. Although UC Merced maintains the right to withdraw any offer of admission if any of the conditions listed below are not met, if you make us aware of any changes we may be able to suggest alternatives in the event your admission appears to be jeopardized.

Transfer applicants must:

1. Maintain eligibility. Complete all courses you indicated as “in progress” or “planned” with grades of C or better, unless the selection criteria for your major indicates otherwise. If you receive a D, F, W, NP or NC grade, you must notify the Office of Admissions immediately by submitting a Transfer Academic Update (TAU) if it is before April 1, or by posting the changes to “myCourseUpdates” in your student portal at my.ucmerced.edu April 1 and thereafter.
2. Be in good standing (minimum 2.0 grade-point average) at your last institution and in your last term, including summer session.
3. Notify the Office of Admissions immediately of any changes in the planned coursework indicated on your application (specifically, adding or withdrawing from any courses or enrolling in a college other than previously indicated) by submitting a TAU if it is before April 1, or by posting the changes to “myCourseUpdates” in your student portal at my.ucmerced.edu April 1 and thereafter. **Please note: We strongly discourage you from changing your schedule.**
4. Ensure that final official transcripts from high schools and all higher-education institutions you attended are submitted to the Office of Admissions. These transcripts must be postmarked or electronically submitted on or before July 1. Final official transcripts must show grades received for the spring term. **If you or your college(s) cannot comply with these conditions, you must notify the Office of Admissions in advance, by email or telephone.**
5. If listed on your my.ucmerced.edu portal, ensure that any additional requirements such as, but not limited to, completion of summer coursework, are received by the Office of Admissions by July 15, unless another date is specified on the portal. This includes official results of external examinations including Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), A-Level examinations, or language proficiency exams such as TOEFL or IELTS.
6. If you plan to enroll in summer courses, your summer term must end prior to Aug. 17.
7. Adhere to the UC Merced student code of conduct, found at ucm.edu/conduct.
