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## Spring 2018 Conditions of Admission First Year Students

Congratulations! Your academic achievements have earned you admission to the University of California, Merced. You must submit a Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) by Nov. 1, 2017, in order to secure your admission to UC Merced. Failure to submit your SIR may result in your admission being withdrawn.

Before submitting your SIR, please read and make sure you understand the Conditions of Admission listed below. Submitting your SIR and accepting this offer of admission signifies your acknowledgment that failure to satisfy any of the conditions listed below will result in UC Merced withdrawing the offer of admission. Please note that the \$250 SIR deposit is nonrefundable, even if your offer of admission is withdrawn.

**Applicants are solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of all academic information they report to UC Merced. If your self-reported information is inconsistent with your actual grades and courses, it will result in cancellation of admission and may jeopardize future admission to any campus of the University of California.**

Our admission decision was based on the information you reported in your application. Accuracy is essential to the admission process, and you must report changes to our office immediately, regardless of whether you believe your admission will be affected. Although UC Merced maintains the right to withdraw any offer of admission if any of the conditions listed below are not met, if you make us aware of any changes, we may be able to suggest alternatives in the event your admission appears to be jeopardized.

Inform the UC Merced Office of Admissions of any changes by posting them to “myCourseUpdates” in the my.ucmerced.edu portal.

**First year applicants must:**

1. Maintain eligibility. Complete all courses you indicated as “in progress” or “planned” with grades of C or better. If you receive a D, F, W, NP or NC grade, you must notify the Office of Admissions immediately by completing the “myCourseUpdates” form in the my.ucmerced.edu portal.
2. Notify the Office of Admissions immediately by email of any changes in the planned coursework indicated on your application (specifically, adding or withdrawing from any courses or enrolling in a college other than previously indicated).  
**Please note: We strongly discourage you from changing your schedule.**
3. Notify the Office of Admissions immediately if you earned a grade below C in any of your senior-year courses by posting them to “myCourseUpdates” in the my.ucmerced.edu portal. One D or F grade in your senior year may cause you to be ineligible for admission to the University of California, and you are obligated to report this grade to UC Merced immediately.
4. Ensure that official scores for the ACT with Writing, SAT Reasoning or SAT with Essay test are submitted to the Office of Admissions by Jan. 6, 2018.
5. If you have completed any Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) exams, submit official scores to the Office of Admissions by Jan. 6, 2018.
6. Ensure that final, official transcripts from all high schools and higher education institutions you have attended are submitted to the Office of Admissions. Transcripts must be postmarked or electronically submitted on or before Jan. 6, 2018. Final official transcripts must show grades received for the fall term.
7. Adhere to the UC Merced student code of conduct, found at [ucm.edu/conduct](http://ucm.edu/conduct).

**Please note:** To have any potential transferable credit reviewed for course placement, unit credit or subject credit, all official documents, including AP or IB exams scores and/or official college transcripts, must be received in the Office of Admissions by Nov. 30, 2017.
