



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR FRESHMEN

Our admission decision was based on information you reported in your application. Promptly report any changes. Please note: applicants are solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of all academic information they report. Inconsistency of self-reported information with actual grades and courses will result in cancellation of admission and may jeopardize future application to any campus of the University of California. Failure to satisfy any of the conditions listed below could result in UC Merced withdrawing the offer of admission. The \$100 fee for the Statement of Intent to Register is nonrefundable, even if your offer of admission is withdrawn, so please read the following carefully.

Conditions of Admission:

1. Complete all courses as listed on your application and any additional updates you gave us. Satisfactory completion means final grades of C or better. You must meet published requirements for admission to the University of California. If you received a Letter of Special Conditions, you must also meet those conditions as listed.
2. Notify the Admissions Office before you change your enrollment in courses you reported on your application or updates. Let us know so we can inform you if the change will jeopardize your admission status.
3. Notify our office immediately if you receive a grade below C. Even one D or F may cause you to be ineligible for the University of California. Early notification to the Admissions office may enable us to address your situation in a way that preserves your admission.
4. All official transcripts and test scores needed for verification of eligibility for admission must be received in the Admissions office prior to January 6, 2010. Registration for spring semester classes depends on the receipt of official transcripts for advising appointments.
5. If you are currently attending high school or are enrolled in college courses, the current term must be finished by the end of December and final grades must be received by January 6, 2010. Spring semester instruction at UC Merced begins January 19.

International Students: If you will require a Student Visa to study in the U.S., ask your prior schools and testing agencies to send your official academic records right away. You must also complete and return the enclosed forms titled, “Student Information Form” and “Financial Statement for International Students.” All of these documents are needed before immigration documents can be prepared for you.
