

Conditions of Admission for Freshmen & Transfer Students Fall 2011

Congratulations! Your academic achievements have resulted in your admission to the University of California, Merced. Please read the Conditions of Admission listed below before submitting your Statement of Intent to Register (SIR). Submitting a positive SIR and accepting this offer of admission signifies your acknowledgment that failure to satisfy any of the conditions listed below could result in UC Merced withdrawing its offer of admission. (Please note: The \$100 Statement of Intent to Register fee is nonrefundable, even if your offer of admission is withdrawn).

Our admission decision was based on information you reported in your application. Promptly report any changes. This will enable us to suggest alternatives for you in the event your admission appears jeopardized.

Applicants are solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of all academic information they report. Inconsistency of self-reported information with actual grades and courses will result in cancellation of admission and may jeopardize future application to any campus of the University of California.

FRESHMEN

1. Complete all senior-year courses as listed on your application and maintain eligibility. You must complete all requirements for admission by the date of your high school graduation.
2. Notify Admissions immediately if you change any courses from those reported on your application or if you earn a senior year grade below C. Even one D or F may cause you to be ineligible for the University of California. Early notification to the Admissions Office may enable us to address your situation.
3. If you have not already done so, request that your official standardized test results be sent to arrive in the Admissions Office before July 15, 2011: ACT with Writing or SAT Reasoning Test and two SAT Subject exams from different subject areas selected from: Literature, Foreign Language, Social Studies, Math Level 2 or Science.
4. If you took Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) examinations, request that official results be sent to arrive in the Admissions Office before July 15, 2011.
5. Arrange to have official high school and college transcripts sent to Admissions before July 15, 2011.
Note: If you enroll in a college summer session, the end date must be prior to August 24, 2011.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

1. Complete all transferable course work with a grade point average consistent with eligibility as a transfer to UC (2.4 minimum California residents, 2.8 minimum non-residents).
2. Complete all courses you indicated as "in progress" or "planned" with grades of C or better.
3. Be in good standing (minimum 2.0 grade point average) at your last institution and in your last term, including summer session.
4. Arrange to have official transcripts from all higher education institutions attended sent to arrive in the Admissions Office before July 15, 2011.
5. Request official Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate examination results to be sent to Admissions before July 15, 2011.
6. Notify Admissions immediately in writing of any changes in the planned coursework indicated on your application (specifically, adding or withdrawing from any courses or enrolling in a college other than that previously indicated).
7. If you enroll in summer session, the end date must be prior to August 24, 2011.

Important Notes:

AB540 students: Follow instructions from the Registrar to request the non-resident tuition exemption.

Attention students who may be required to obtain an F-1 student visa to study in the United States:

If you require an F-1 visa to study in the United States you must notify Admissions immediately and promptly respond to requests for additional information and required documents. Completion of required documents is necessary to issue the I-20, the legal documentation required for obtaining a student visa/immigration status to stay in the U.S. If you are uncertain about your visa status, please contact an immigration adviser at a U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services office to learn more about your visa status.
