### **REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION**

For admission to the Sociology, B.A. major, students must earn an overall GPA of 2.4 or better, and <u>must</u> complete classes articulated with the following UC Merced courses prior to admission:

 $\circ$  SOC 1 and SOC 10

It your college does not offer an articulated course for SOC 10, you should complete UC Merced's MATH 5 (see articulation agreement by department) and complete SOC 10 at UC Merced after transfer.

Transfer students seeking fall admission should have the following completed by the end of the spring term preceding fall enrollment at UC Merced:

- 1. All minimum admission requirements including appropriate courses in math and the equivalent of WRI 1 and WRI 10 (see articulation by department on ASSIST.org).
- 2. All major preparation requirements as stated above.

All course work must be completed with a 'C' or better.
